At a Glance

Agri grows 5.1%

The agriculture sector grew by 5.1percent (constant prices) in 2004, much higher than its 3.7 percent growth in 2003 and the fastest growth since 2000. At current prices, agricultural output grossed P783.9 billion, 18.4 percent higher than the previous year.

All subsectors except livestock posted positive growths. Fishery posted the highest growth among the subsectors, at 9.4 percent in 2004, from 2003's 7.5 percent. Agricultural crops increased from 2.8 percent to 4.9 percent, while poultry recovered from the sluggish 1.9 percent in 2003 to 4.2 percent in 2004.

Agricultural crops. Comprising 48.9 percent of agriculture's total value, all agricultural crops grew in 2004. The overall value of production increased by 15.7 percent, from P330.9 billion in 2003 to P393.2 billion in 2004 at current prices. Value of production grew by 15.8 percent, mainly due to the 11.0 percent increase in farm gate prices. Total volume of production, meanwhile, increased by 4.5 percent.

The increase in the volume of corn and rice production of 17.1 percent and 7.4 percent respectively, contributed largely to the overall volume growth in the crops sector. This is fairly high considering that during the same period, corn and rice production in neighboring countries posted low to negative growth rates.

Livestock. The livestock subsector was sluggish in 2004 as output contracted by 0.4 percent. Its overall share to agricultural output slightly increased, from 17.3 percent to 18.6 percent. Farm gate prices increased sharply by 27.5 percent.

Poultry. In 2004, the poultry production rose by 4.2 percent as the production of all poultry commodities improved except duck. Likewise, farm gate prices increased, bringing the total value of production (at current price) to P115.9 billion compared to P96.69 billion in 2003.

Fisheries. Among all sectors, fisheries grew fastest at 9.5 percent led by aquaculture. Total fisheries production rose from 3.62 million MT to 3.93 million MT. Likewise, the value of production increased, from P119.87 to P139.08. But in terms of share to total agricultural output, volume remained static at 4.8 percent.
